Empowering UBC Science students

UBC Science students have talent, drive and curiosity. They have the potential to make new discoveries, shift paradigms, start companies, and even spark new industries. Unfortunately, they do not all have the financial means to complete their education—an essential step to realizing their potential. Student loans and summer jobs do not always cover the cost of living, books and tuition.

The Faculty of Science Bursaries help students with unmet financial needs. For many, attending university is possible only because of these awards. Since these bursaries were first disbursed in 2002, a growing community of donors has committed to supporting our students. To date:

- 275 bursaries have been awarded
- \$272,000+ total has been disbursed

These awards empower students with greater financial security and choice, ensuring an enriching university education that prepares UBC Science graduates to help advance healthy lives, create solutions for the planet and shape thriving societies.

Our bursary recipients

Recipients of the Faculty of Science Bursaries are selected based on financial need. The awards—the amount of which varies—are available to eligible students who are experiencing hardship for a number of reasons including a funding shortfall or an unexpected change in circumstances.

While the bursaries provide students with a crucial monetary benefit, they also give them the motivation to continue their studies and build on their education to pursue their career goals.

Our bursary recipients are part of a community of students and scholars that is recognized for its commitment to discovery and innovation. They are students across UBC's broad range of disciplines, many

of which earn top marks in Canada and are among the best globally. After graduation, UBC Science alumni go on to contribute in critical sectors such as health care, environmental sciences and biotechnology. Each of their journeys began with the foundational knowledge and skills they gained through UBC Science subjects including:
